| Superstars- Extra curricular clubs | | To provide opportunities for teachers to observe specialist PE coaches. | PE lead observed once a term and worked alongside superstars to ensure consistent quality. Each term children developed skills in a different area of sport. |

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| | | | <p>Target tracker (data tracking system) updated 3 times a year and showed progression with more children achieving ARE (age related expectations).</p> <p>Children provided with after school clubs taught by specialist coach. Improved the amount of children taking part in sport.</p> <p>By the end of the year 83% of the school had taken part in after school sports clubs.</p> <p>53% of these were boys and 47% were girls (this was an increase on girls from the previous year).</p> <p>51% were pupil premium and 49% were non-pupil premium.</p> |
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| Oasis Brightstowe partnership | £100 | To improve participation in competitive sporting activities. | Children got to take part in sports competitions with other schools. |
| Sports equipment | | To ensure children were using quality equipment. | Sainsbury's vouchers were used to increase the amount of gross motor skill activities. |
| PE kits | £80 | To ensure all children are taking part in appropriate sporting clothing. | All children are taking part in appropriate clothing. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Drop-ins conducted by the PE lead. - Letters sent home to remind parents/carers about PE kits. |
