

Attendance

Our school target for attendance is 96%. At the moment, we are well below that at 93.4%. This is of considerable concern as children's achievement is directly linked to good attendance.



If a child is a persistently absent with attendance below 90% (this equates to 28 days off in a school year <u>for whatever reason</u>), research has confirmed that they are unlikely to fulfil their academic potential. Similarly, lateness can have a very significant impact on a child's learning. Skills work starts at 8:45am and is a key time to consolidate core skills such as times tables, spellings and sentence construction. If a child arrives after 9:30 they are marked as absent for the morning session – an unauthorised absence.

Every Minute Counts

Lateness = Lost Learning (the figures below are calculated over a school year)

5 minutes late each day = 3 days lost!

10 minutes late each day = 6.5 days lost!

15 minutes late each day= 10 days lost!

20 minutes late each day = 13 days lost!

30 minutes late each day = 19 days lost!

It is parent/carer's legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly if they are statutory school age. Please be aware that persistent absence may lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued. This can be issued if there are more than 8 unauthorised absences in a 10 week period.

Education research is very clear that good attendance is essential to pupil's achieving well at school and is a good indicator for success in later life. We are striving to reach our whole school target of 96% attendance and can offer support and advice to improve your child's attendance. 1:45 – 2:00pm: A brief presentation for parents and carers in the school hall 2-3pm: An invitation to join us for an hour of play on the school site


ELSA
