

Attendance

Our school target for attendance is 96% and we know that every day in school counts. Unfortunately, a large number of children are consistently not meeting this target and worryingly some children have attendance below 90% which puts them in the risk bracket of 'persistent absentees' and means they have missed 4 weeks of school over the school year. If you need support with getting your child into school please ask – we are here to help.

If your child's attendance is significantly below our school target we will be in contact to offer support and you will be required to provide medical evidence for any illness. If attendance does not improve for your child you will be invited to a meeting with the head or deputy where we can look in more depth at any barriers to attending school.

If your child is absent for an unauthorised reason, for example a holiday, for 4 days within a 10 week period you are likely to receive a **penalty notice and fine**. We really want the best for every single child at Sea Mills and good attendance is directly linked to a child's achievement, happiness and success in school.



Every Minute Counts

Lateness = Lost Learning (the figures below are calculated over a school year)

5 minutes late each day = 3 days lost!

10 minutes late each day = 6.5 days lost!

15 minutes late each day = 10 days lost!

20 minutes late each day = 13 days lost!

30 minutes late each day = 19 days lost!

How we communicate with families

- Termly Class Newsletters- this covers what is coming up in your child's class that term. It will have information on the curriculum, homework, dates as well as reminders about PE days and anything else that goes on in the classroom
- Monthly Head Teachers Newsletter- This will share important information with parents such as: up and coming changes to school life and policy, inform parents how they can support children at home, remind parents about what the school offers, review special events of the month that has passed, share dates of the coming month and much more
- Website- The school's website is kept as up to date as possible and holds a wealth of information such as: our values, our intent, our policies, our classes, our curriculum. Most of our parent's questions about what happens and our approaches in school can be found here. On our community and signposting pages, you can find information on activities happening in the community. Our website can also be translated in to most languages.
- Email— Our main mode of communication is via email. This may be the newsletters or correspondence relating to a specific trip, event, health and safety matter etc. Please ensure we hold a valid and up to date email address for you so you do not miss out on vital communication.
- **SMS-** We sometime need to urgently alert or remind parents about events so occasionally we will send an **SMS**. Please ensure we hold your up to date mobile number so you do not miss out on vital communication.
- Phone call We will only call parents in response to a communication or in an emergency. Please ensure we hold your up to date number as well as at least 2 emergency contacts so you do not miss out on emergency communication. This is essential for health and safety reasons.
- In person- We operate an open door policy and are always willing to talk to parents. If you need to speak with a member of staff a good time for this is drop off or collections as during the day most staff will be busy teaching. During the pandemic, we have had to postpone our coffee mornings. From Term 2 we will be starting these again on Thursdays; this is a good time to catch up with senior leaders.
