
Every Minute Counts

Every Minute Counts

Lateness = Lost Learning (the figures below are calculated over a school year)

5 minutes late each day = 3 days lost!
10 minutes late each day = 6.5 days lost!
15 minutes late each day= 10 days lost!
20 minutes late each day = 13 days lost!

30 minutes late each day = 19 days lost!



Persistent Absence:

A child will be designated "persistently absent" when their attendance falls below 90% (this equates to 28 days off in a school year <u>for whatever reason</u>). It is parent/carer's legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly if they are statutory school age. Please be aware that persistent absence may lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued or prosecution.

Education research is very clear that good attendance is essential to pupil's achieving well at school and is a good indicator for success in later life. We are striving to reach our whole school target of 96% attendance and can offer support and advice to improve your child's attendance.
