Importance of reading

- ▶ Expand vocabulary
- ▶ Increase general knowledge
- ▶ Helps to understand other subjects!
- ▶ Daily reading record checks
- ▶ Children should be reading at least 3 times a week.
- ▶ There will be reading prizes!



Things to do at home...(some ideas!)

▶ Reading

- ▶ Children are encouraged to read daily at home. When they do, please record it in their reading records. There are rewards the more they read! Year 6s can be independent – they can read out loud to you or read to themselves. You can discuss what happens in the book.

▶ Spellings

- ▶ There will be 2-3 groups. Children will be given their spellings at the end of each term for the following term. Certificates and more rewards for children who get full marks each week! Spelling Shed is used to help them practise. Encourage children to remind themselves of the rules.

▶ Times tables

- ▶ This plays an important part for all areas of Maths. You don't have to memorise all 144...

How can I help with reading?

- ▶ Find a quiet place
- ▶ Using phonics by segmenting and blending any uncertain words
- ▶ Use pictures and letter sounds the word starts with
- ▶ Asking questions about what they have read, making predictions, questioning meaning

- ▶ School uniform will consist of:

- ▶ Black/grey trousers or skirt
- ▶ White or red polo shirt
- ▶ Red jumper/cardigan
- ▶ School shorts
- ▶ Red/white dress

- ▶ P.E. Kits:

- ▶ Black shorts or jogging bottoms
- ▶ White t-shirt
- ▶ Trainers or daps

- ▶ 3 Golden Rules:

- ▶ Going for Gold:

What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check out the guidance on applying to schools – available at www.bristol.gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community secondaries the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. School websites provide details of open evenings and other events.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 31 October 2023.

Why apply online?

- The system helps you by checking for errors.
- There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post.
- It is quick and easy to do.
- You will get an immediate email confirming that your application has been received.
- You will receive an email notification of the outcome of your application on the same day as the offer letters are posted.
- The system is available 24 hours a day until the final submission time of midnight on 31 October 2023.
