If your child completes one of the challenges successfully then please let us know by sending them in with a photo, emailing the office or sending a note to the class teacher to confirm they have completed a challenge.

For each challenge completed, your child will get a raffle ticket for the end of term draw and have a chance of winning a book token and a bubble gun! They will only get one raffle ticket for each challenge completed i.e. not 3 tickets for 3 lots of washing up!

Near miss - please take care!

Last week, a parent reported that a car mounting the kerb just outside the school just missed their child while walking to school. Drop off and pick up is a very busy time outside the school so please park with care and consideration of both our pupils and our neighbours.

Please do not:

- Park on the zig zag lines - we have requested that they are repainted.
- Mount the kerb as this restricts access which is difficult for families with buggies or disabilities.
- Park over our neighbours drives.

Please try to:

- ◇ Walk or cycle to school.
- ◇ Park on nearby streets if at all possible and walk the last part of the journey to avoid congestion. St Edyths have given permission for parents to park in their car park when dropping/collecting children and this is a 1 minute walk away.

We have requested PCSO support to visit at these busy times and ensure that parking is appropriate and legal.
